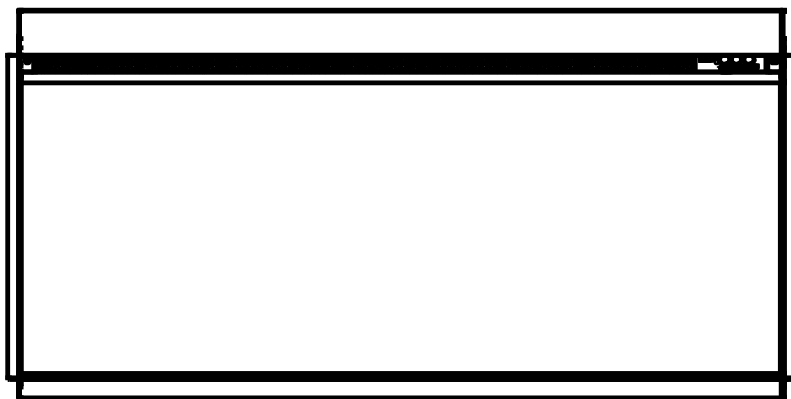

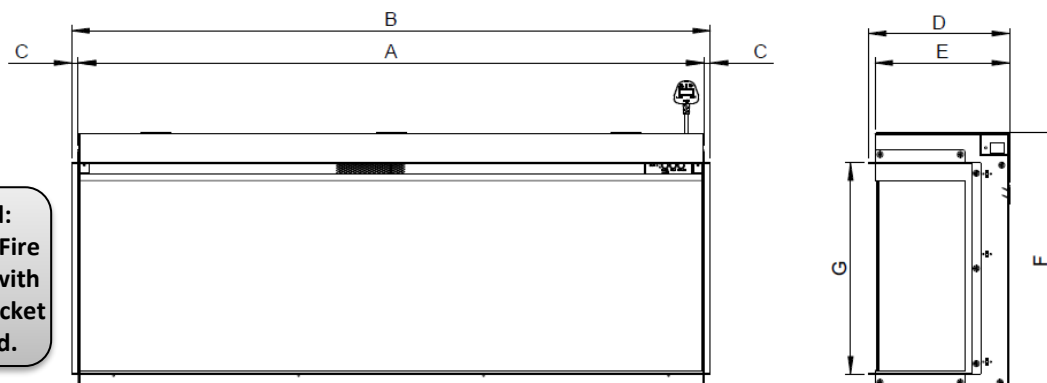

Important Safety Information

Read all the instructions carefully before using the appliance.

For indoor use only. This appliance is not suitable for use outside the house and only suitable for well insulated spaces or occasional use.

If the fire is to be placed into an existing chimney opening and there is any risk of chimney debris falling down onto the fire or drafts from the chimney it is recommended that the flue or opening is sealed off with non-combustible non-fibrous insulation materials. Do not place into an existing fireplace that is prone to dampness. Should it be necessary to cap and seal the chimney to prevent personal injury, a professional should be hired to do the work.

Do not use this appliance in the immediate surroundings of a bath, a shower or a swimming pool.

Do not use this fire as a free-standing appliance. It must always be fixed to the wall, fireplace mantel, floor etc.

This fire must not be located immediately below a socket-outlet.

This appliance must be earthed.

This appliance must not be supplied through an external switching device, such as a timer, or connected to a circuit which is regularly switched on and off by utility to avoid a hazard due to the inadvertent resetting of the thermal cut out.

A non-rewireable plug fitted with a 13A fuse is supplied. Should the fuse or plug need replacing, and you are competent to do so, it must be replaced with a 13A fuse or plug being 13A BS1363A approved.

If the power cord is damaged, it must be repaired by the manufacturer, its authorised service centre or professional person.

The meaning of this symbol  is **DO NOT COVER**

Warning: in order to avoid overheating, do not allow the appliance to be covered or let the air inlet/outlet become obstructed.

To reduce the risk of fire, keep textiles, curtains, or any other flammable material a minimum distance of 1 meter from the air outlet.

Keep the power cord away from hot surfaces and hot conditions. Do not route the power lead in front of the appliance.

Do not use this fire in rooms that have explosive fumes in them (for example petrol), or if you are using solvents, glue, aerosol spray or in flammable paints, as these may catch fire.

This appliance can be used by children aged from 8 years and above and persons with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities or lack of experience and knowledge if they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance in a safe way and understand the hazards involved.

Children and vulnerable people must be supervised at all times when using this appliance, as some parts can become very hot and cause burns.

Do not use this appliance in small rooms when they are occupied by persons not capable of leaving the room on their own, unless constant supervision is provided.

Cleaning and user maintenance shall not be made by children without supervision.

Children aged from 3 years, and less than 8 years only can switch on / off the appliance provided that it has been placed or installed in its intended normal operating position and instructions and supervisions concerning the safe way of the use of the appliance are offered. Children aged from 3 years, and less than 8 years shall not plug in, regulate and clean the appliance or perform user maintenance.

This appliance shall not be played with by children.

Children of less than 3 years should be kept away unless continuously supervised.

Keep the power plug accessible after installation.

Manual Handling

BEFORE STARTING THE INSTALLATION OF THIS FIRE, PLEASE READ THE FOLLOWING:

CAUTION: This appliance is heavy. Always seek assistance whilst unpacking and/or during installation.

The installation should be carried out by **two adults** to avoid injury or damage. If for any reason it is considered too heavy, please obtain assistance.

Always use the handles on the rear of fire where possible.

When lifting the electric appliance, always keep your back straight. Bend your legs and not your back. Avoid twisting at the waist. It is better to reposition your feet.

Avoid upper body / top heavy bending. Always bend from the knees rather than the waist. Do not lean forward or sideways while handling the fire.

Always ensure you have a firm grip of the fire before lifting.

Always keep the fire as close to the body as possible. This will minimize the cantilever action.

Use gloves to provide additional grip.

Unpacking The Fire- IQFX 3SL

Note: The fire is a two adult person lift. A second person will be required to lift and support the fire during installation.

Before the fire can be installed, consideration will need to be given to routing the power supply to the fire. This will affect the stages of the installation process. We advise a qualified electrician conduct any electrical parts of the installation.

Note: An accessible single socket is required for the operation of the fire.

Unpack your new fire- **DO NOT** dispose of the packaging until you have checked and made sure all the parts and fixings listed on **Page 6** are present.

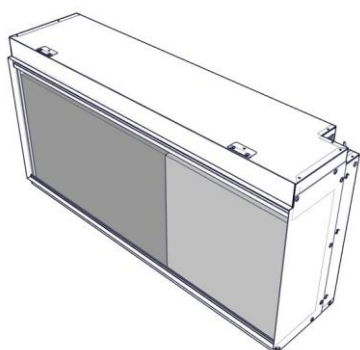

Once the fire is unpacked the **Cardboard Boxes** inside the fire need to be removed and the contents checked, as listed on **Page 6**.

Note: The fire is a two adult person lift.

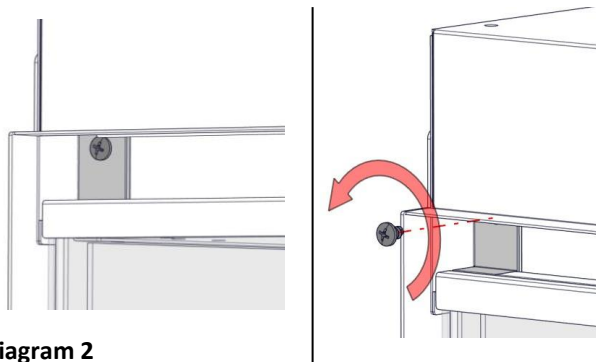

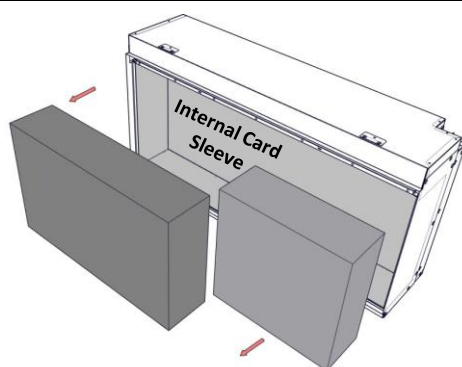


Once the screws are removed- the **Glass** and **Glass Bracket** can be angled forward from the top of the fire and lifted out of the channel at the base of the glass.

Note: Place the Glass, Glass Bracket and 2 X Screws in a safe place- these will be required later.

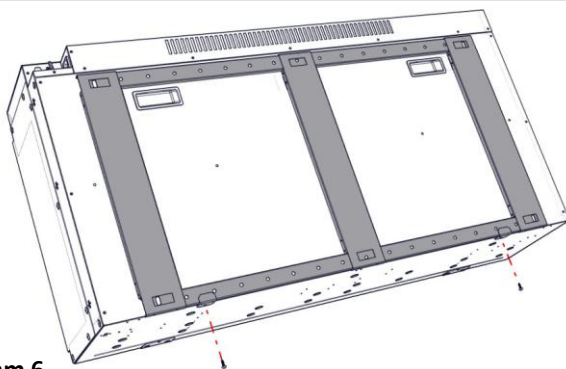


Remove the **Cardboard Boxes** from inside the fire and depending on the model purchased, check the contents as listed on **Page 6 & 7**.

Tip- Leave the protective internal card sleeve in place. This will help keep the internal of the fire clean during installation.

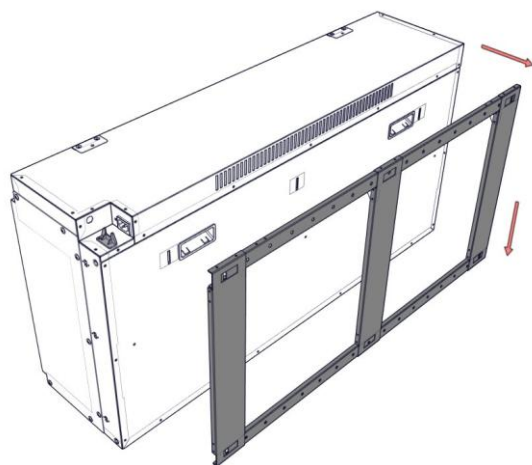
For installation into a **floor to ceiling stud wall**, the **Rear Mounting Bracket** must be first removed from the fire.

With the fire positioned on the floor lean the fire forward and remove the **2 X Screws** holding the bracket in place.

Note: For other methods of installation, the Rear Fixing Bracket maybe required to fix the fire to the wall. Please ensure that suitable fixings are used dependent on the wall medium.

Once the screws are removed- lower the bracket and lift the bracket away from the rear of the fire.

The bracket and screws are no longer required, please discard.

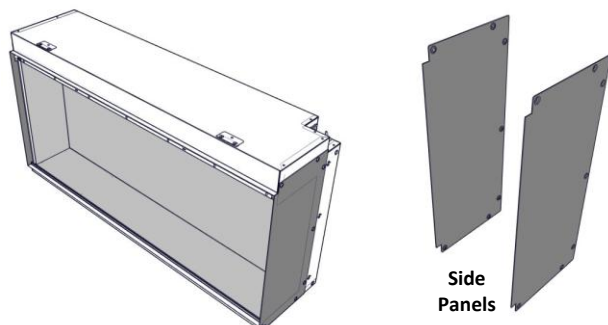

1 Sided (Fully Recessed) Installation

The fire comes out the box, already set up for **1 sided** installation.

The 2 X **Side Panels** will be **fixed** to the fire.

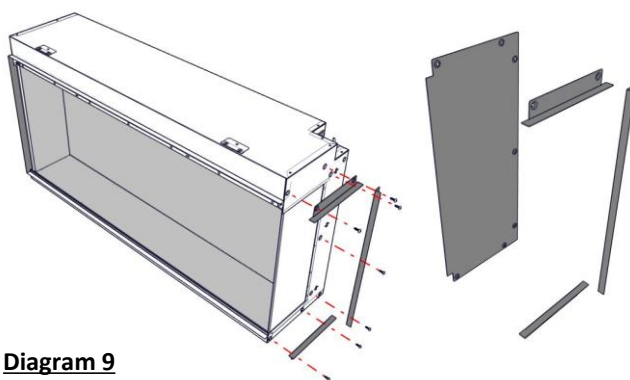

2-Sided Installation- Right Hand

Leaving the left-hand side panel **fixed**.
Remove the **7 or 8 X Screws** and the **right-hand** side panel from the fire.

Locate the **2 X Small Side Brackets** and **1 X Large Side Bracket** and fix in place using the previously removed **7 or 8 X Screws**.

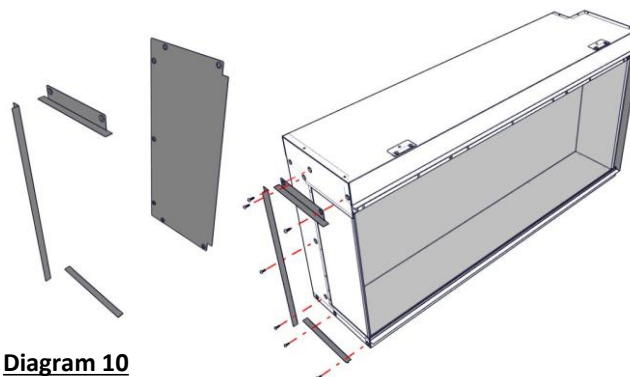

2-Sided Installation- Left Hand

Leaving the right-hand side panel fixed.
Remove the **7 or 8 X Screws** and the **left-hand** side panel from the fire.

Locate the **2 X Small Side Brackets** and **1 X Large Side Bracket** and fix in place using the previously removed **7 or 8 X Screws**.

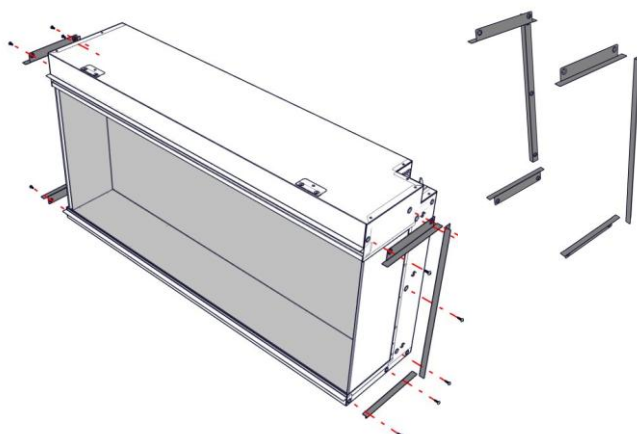

3-Sided Installation

Remove the **14 or 16 X Screws** and the **left-hand** and **right-hand** side panels from the fire.

Locate the **4 X Small Side Brackets** and **2 X Large Side Brackets** and fix in place using the previously removed **14 or 16 X Screws**.

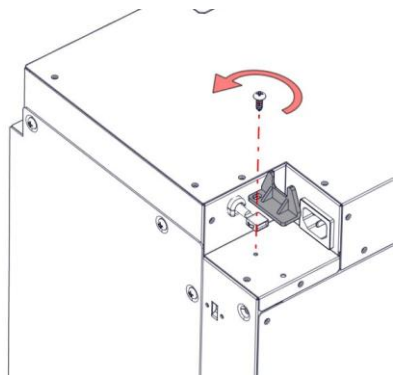

Before fitting the fire ensure the power cable is installed.

Remove the **1 X Screw** holding the power cable **fixing clip** in place.

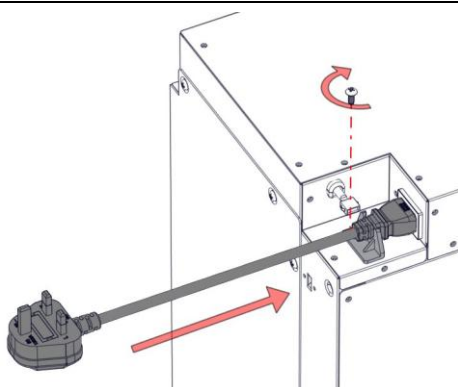

Once removed place the cable clip under **IEC** end of the power cable - insert the **IEC** into the connector port on the fire.

Finally screw the cable clip back in place.

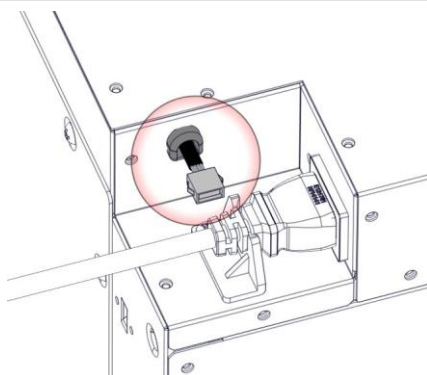

If installing the **Optional LED Light Set**, familiarise yourself with where the LED Light Set connects into the fire. These must be connected prior to installing the fire.

830mm Fly Lead plus 3m LED lights are provided in a set.

Note: A compatible **LED Light Set** is available from **Bemodern Ltd. (Code: 110094)**. Other makes may not be suitable and will void the warranty.

NOTE: When the LED Light Set is fitted, they should be checked for operation before the access is closed off by the installation. It is advisable to have an access panel in the installation should you need to access the LED Light Set connection after the installation.

Installation IQFX 3SL - Stud wall

Once the fire has been prepared, use the following opening dimensions to construct the stud wall which the fire will be housed in.

The stud wall must include a **header** as specified in the following diagrams. This is to ensure that the weight of the finished wall is not resting on top of the fire. The base of the opening/stud work must also be able to take the full weight of the appliance.

The fire should be positioned on a firm level surface and in a clean ‘dust free’ environment. If fitted into an open chimney, the chimney must be blocked off to reduce the risk of draught and damp through the fire, which may cause the safety cut out system in the fan heater to operate.

Note: Any protruding headers MUST be made of a non-combustible material.

To install into a stud wall the mounting bracket must be removed from the rear of the fire as previously shown in **Diagram 6 and 7, Page 8**.

Once the stud wall has been constructed and secured to the wall and the fire is in its final position, ensure that the power cable has been installed- **See diagrams 12 and 13, Page 10** and there is power to the fire before any cladding / plasterboard is installed.

Ensure the design of the stud wall allows for the plug or fuse spur to be easily accessible.

Note: The following diagrams are examples of how the stud wall could be constructed- Please adjust to your bespoke design, ensuring the ‘required opening sizes’ detailed in the following tables are adhered to. This will ensure the minimum clearances are maintained during installation.

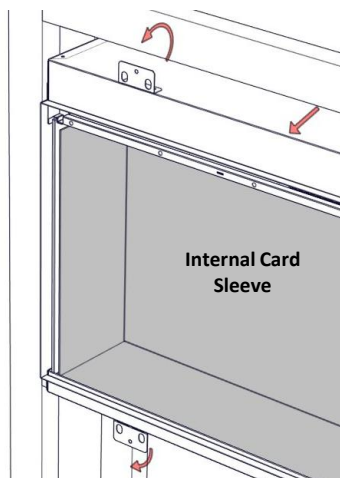

Note: The fire is a two adult person lift

Lift the fire into the stud wall opening- leaving approx. **50mm** of the fire protruding to the front.

Unfolded the **fixing brackets** at the top and bottom of the fire.

See Diagram 18

Tip: Leave the protective internal card sleeve in place. This will help the keep the internal of the fire clean during the plastering/finishing stage of installation.

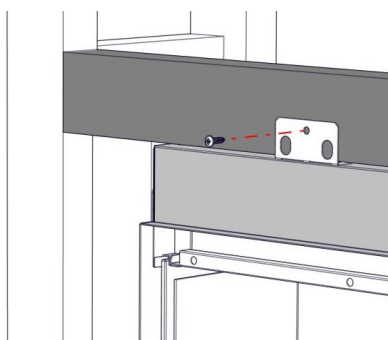

Once the brackets are unfolded push the fire into position, ensuring the face of the fire is flush with the face of the stud wall.

If the faces are not flush- there is adjustment on the top and bottom fixing brackets. Adjust accordingly.

Note: The brackets will sit proud of the finished surface.

Once in place screw through the holes in the **fixing brackets**- securing the fire to the stud wall. **Note:** These screws **are not** provided.

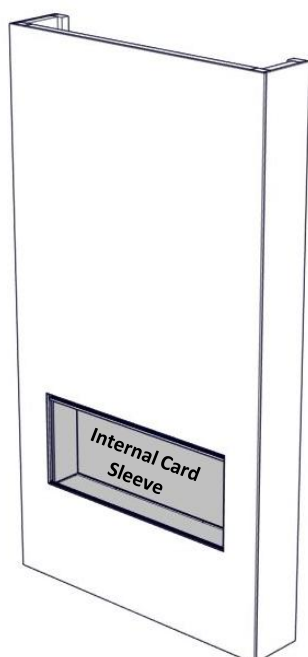

Note: Before proceeding further ensure there is power to the fire, and it is operating correctly.

Note: If the optional Led Light Kit has been purchased ensure this has been connected to the relevant port on the fire-before cladding / plasterboard is installed See Diagram 14- Page 10.

Note: Ensure the plug / fuse spur and optional LED Light Set can be fully accessible once the cladding / plasterboard is installed.

Once the above has been checked- Clad / plasterboard, skim and finish the stud wall and remove the internal card sleeve and discard.

Tip: Position the sealed edge of the plasterboard against the fire brackets protruding from the fire., This will help maintain a clean/sharp edge.

The fuel bed can now be dressed and the logs positioned.

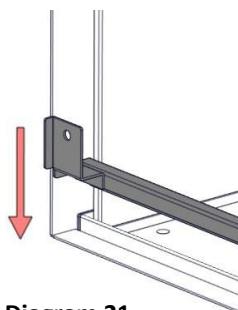
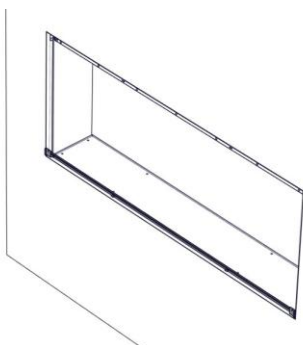

Tip: Before dressing the fuel bed- position the previously removed glass bracket in the channel in the base of the fire, this will help to stop the smaller fuel bed material falling into the channel during installation.

The dressing of the fuel bed can be **fully tailored** to the customers **individual tastes**. Enough of each fuel bed finishing material has been provided to cover the fuel bed in a **single type** of material.

Fuel Bed Dressing- As a starting point follow the example below:

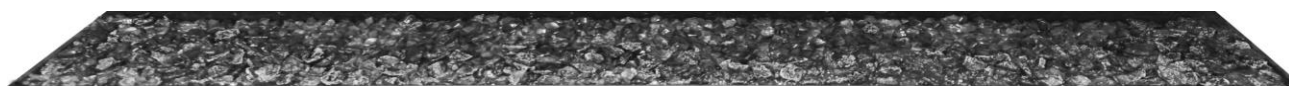


Diagram 22- Place the **Crystallised Pebbles / Smoked Crystals** over the fuel bed, enough material has been provided to cover the fuel bed.

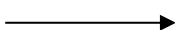
Diagram 25- Above shows an example of the **17 X** log set up for the **IQFX 1800 3SL** .

Note: Locate the 'Log LED Light Assembly' envelope and insert the LED lights into logs with holes in the bottom. The illuminated logs then need to be connected to the connection points in the fuel bed and fly-leads positioned accordingly so they are hidden out of sight.

Replacing The Glass- IQFX 3SL

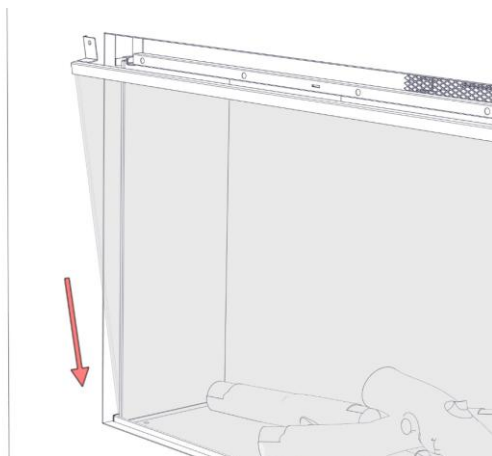

Finally, the **Glass** and **Glass Bracket** can be refitted, using the previously removed **2 X Screws**.

Tip- Check the channel in the base of the fire is free of any fuel bed material before proceeding further.

Centralize the **Glass Bracket** on top of the **Glass**.

Tip- Ensure the rear of the glass is clean before fixing in place.

With the cleaned **Glass** and **Glass Bracket** angled forward slightly, position in the channel in the base of the fire.

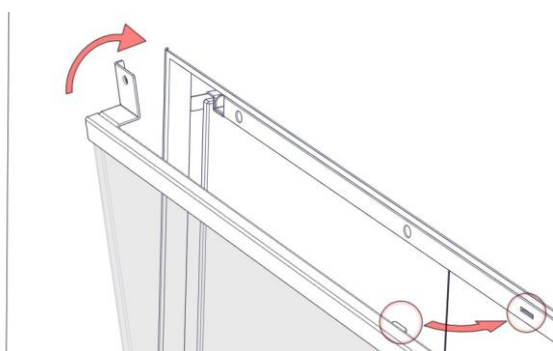

Carefully push the **Glass** and **Glass Bracket** back towards the installed fire ensuring the **tabs** on the Glass Bracket align with the **cut outs** on the fire and that the **holes** on the Glass Bracket align with the **holes** on the fire.

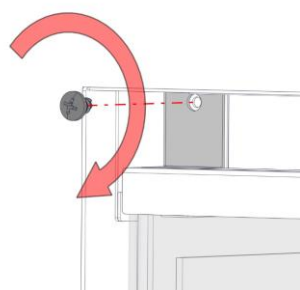
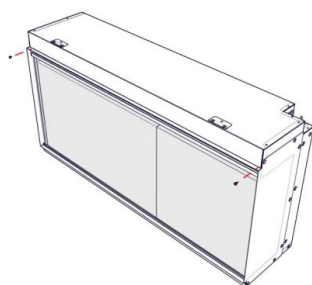

Once in the correct position secure with the **2 X Screws**. **1 X Screw** either side of the fire.

User Instructions - Introduction

WARNING! Do not operate the appliance if it is damaged or has malfunctioned. If you suspect the appliance is damaged or has malfunctioned call a qualified service engineer to inspect the appliance, and replace any part of the electrical system, if necessary, before reuse.

WARNING! To reduce the risk of fire, keep textiles, curtains, or any other flammable material a minimum distance of 1 meter from the air outlet.

MAKE SURE the plug fits tight in the outlet. Faulty wall outlet connections or loose plugs can cause the appliance to overheat.

Do not disconnect the power at the mains supply whilst the appliance is running. Use the functions on the remote to turn the fire off and ensure the mains switch has been moved to the off position before disconnecting.

PREPARATION FOR USE

This appliance can be operated by manual control, remote control or APP. NOTE: To use the appliance the main power switch must be in the 'ON' position.

Batteries

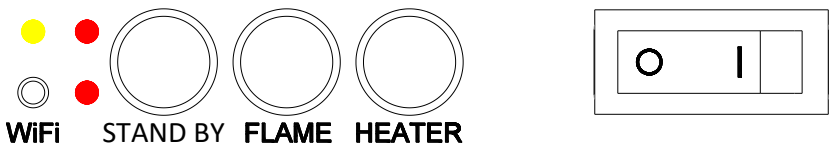
Ensure that the handset batteries are new and inserted correctly.

Main Power Switch

This needs to be switched ON before operating the appliance.
A long beep will be heard to indicate the fire is ready for use.

User Instructions – Manual Control

NOTE: The manual buttons control basic functions, not a full range of controls. Use the remote handset or APP to carry out all functions.



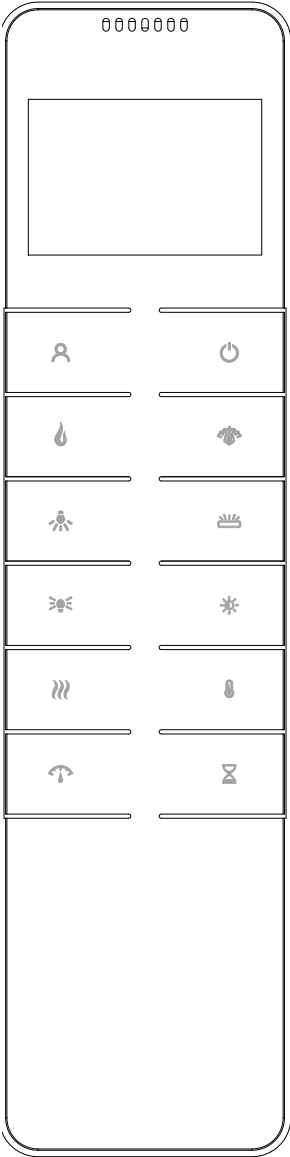

	Stand by	The Stand by button will turn the fireplace ON / OFF. This button will turn ON / OFF all the functions at once and will store the settings.
	My Flame	Press the button to turn on the flame effect, amber light and log illumination .Hold the button for 3 seconds to memorise the current setting of the flame setting, light, brightness and flame speed.
	Flame	Press the button to enter the Flame effect adjustment screen, press the button to cycle through 5 settings(1,2,3,4,OFF) .
	Log Illumination	Press the button to enter the Illuminated logs setting, press the button to turn on or off the illuminated logs.
	Downlights	Press the button to enter the Downlight adjustment screen. Press the button to cycle through the 8 colour settings. Selecting setting 9 will cycle the 8 colours, setting 10 is to turn off the downlights
	FUEL BED	Press the button to enter the Fuel Bed adjustment screen. Press the button to cycle through the 8 colour settings. Selecting setting 9 will cycle the 8 colours, setting 10 is to turn off the fuel bed.
	HEATING	Press the button, and the heater will cycle the heat setting: LOW-HIGH-OFF-AUTO.
	TIMER	Press the button to set the desired time for the fireplace to run. The Timer can be set 0.5H, 1.0H, and then each hour up to 10.0H.
	TEMPERATURE	Press the button to adjust the temperature : 5-40°C(41-99°F). The temperature can be switched between °C and °F.
	FLAME SPEED	Press the button to enter the FLAME SPEED setting. The flame speed has 3 settings to choose from.
	BRIGHTNESS	Press the button to enter the BRIGHTNESS setting. There are 5 brightness levels to choose from.
	MOOD LIGHTING	Press the button to enter the Mood Lightning setting. Press the button to cycle through the 13 colours, setting 14 will cycle automatically through the 13 colours, setting 15 will switch the lights off.

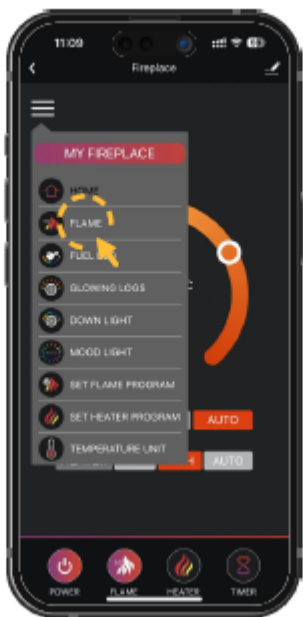
